- To listen to your message, key
+ 44 802 090 100 
then when connected, key
your mobile number,
followed by *****
- During the greeting, key
*** 8 7 0 5**
(or your Voicemail 901 PIN)
then key **2**
- Listen to your messages, as
described on page 6.

leaving a message directly in a Voicemail 901 mailbox


- Anyone can leave a message
directly in a BT Voicemail 901
mailbox from abroad, just as
they can from the UK.
- To leave a message from abroad,
dial
+ 44 802 090 100
- When connected, key
recipient's mobile number,
then key ***** ,
then leave your message after
the greeting.
- If you cannot access the + sign
on your handset, use **00**

*When a message is left for you,
Voicemail 901 will let you know by
sending you a Text message. If the
foreign network does not support
Text messaging, you should
periodically phone in to check for
messages.*

Managing your calls

Call Display **FREE**


When your phone rings, the caller's
number will be displayed on the
phone display unless the caller has
withheld their number.

- If you don't wish to take the call,
key 

If you have Voicemail 901
switched on, (see page 5), the
call will be diverted to your
mailbox.

The service also shows your mobile
number to people you are calling
(equipment dependant).

to withhold your number

- To withhold your number on a
call-by-call basis, key
1 4 1 then
the **phone number** then 
- To withhold your number
permanently, call your Service
Provider.

Once you have done this, you
can disclose your number for
one call only, by keying


1 4 7 0 then
the **phone number** then 

*Call Display and 1471 will not work when the caller has
withheld their number, when the caller is using certain types of
payphone, from some non-BT networks or when the call is
being made to or from international networks.*

You can find out the number of
the last caller when available,
together with the date and time of
the call,

key **1 4 7 1** 

- When you have listened to the
message,
key 

This information will be stored by
BT Cellnet, even if your mobile
phone is switched off or out of
coverage.

0800 and 0500 numbers

You can access the whole range of
0800 and **0500** numbers from
your mobile phone. However these
calls will be charged at your normal
tariff's rates.

- To call these numbers, leave out
the first **0**. For example,
key **800 800 150**
